5.1 Ration packs in reference to catering at fires- Blake Moore

Blake Moore advised members that there are now ration packs available for all brigade vehicles to assist with catering in the event of incidents/fires.

5.2 Amalgamation of Dunsborough and Yallingup Rural BFB resolution- Tanya Gillett

(Ref section 5.2 from previous minutes)

Tanya Gillet updated the members that the resolution to this is for a roundtable workshop to be held to provide the opportunity and space for any and all ideas to be put forward and discussed. The approach is to brainstorm suggestions for the building, what to build, who to occupy the building etc. The building will be happening regardless, however the city wants to support the brigade members in creating a building that has the brigade consensus. Once there is a platform and direction the proposal will be presented to the Department of Fire and Emergency Services for their review. This workshop is forecast to happen in March 2020.

6.1 Overview on the brigade training kits - Peter Stark and Todd Johnson

There will be 6 training modules as part of the brigade training kits rolled out to brigades in March 2020. These will be modules such as AIIMS Structure, Burn over drills and radio training. All of the content for these units are extracted from Department of Fire and Emergency services to ensure the training is rolled out in alignment with standards.

Tanya Gillett said thank you and acknowledged that this training is a great way to ensuring consistency and ensuring there is the same skill set across the board.

6.2 New Occupational Health and Safety Act changes - Blake Moore

Be aware that there are new changes coming to the Occupational Health and Safety Act which will class all volunteers are considered employees of the City of Busselton. This may introduce minimum entrance and training requirements.

6.3 Ambulance brigade training opportunity – Todd Johnson

Offering brigade members training on defibrillators, life threatening injuries and situations, bleeding, neck injuries, burns etc. This training has already been rolled out to Sussex and Vasse

brigades who both commented at BFAC that it is valuable training, very worthwhile and highly recommended that all brigades take part. It is a good refresher for brigade first aid equipment, finding that during Sussex's brigade training their defibrillator had failed when being turned on. Please advertise throughout your brigades for the available position of a Deployment Officer. This position will be responsible for organising trucks, the dietary requirements of the crew members, next of kin information, and collate to present it back to Blake or Allan.

9.3 Clarification on Harvest, Vehicle Movement, Hot Works and Combustion Engines Ban – Blake Moore

When a ban has been declared you must not:

- Light a fire in the open air
- Cook outside in the open air using an open fire (this includes under verandas and patios)
- Move vehicles or plant equipment in bushland or paddocks (this includes fire break works, property inspections, spraying, slashing/mowing and vehicle movements through vineyards)
- Harvesting (including but not limited to forestry, cereal, wineries and irrigated fruit or vegetable area)
- Use or operation of any engine, vehicle, plant, equipment or machinery in the area likely to cause a bush fire or contribute to the spread of a bushfire (this includes but no limited to road shouldering with graders)
- Undertake 'hot works' such as welding, grinding or activity that may cause a spark or ignition unless you have an exemption issued by DFES

Use fireworks or hot air balloons.

When a ban has been declared you may:

- Use a gas cooker or barbeque with an enclosed flame on your own property or in a public recreational area designated for that purpose
- o Undertake essential feeding and watering of livestock
- o Use mowers, chainsaws, line and hedge trimmers and similar plant in built up urban environments which are clear of flammable materials or surrounded by green grass etc.
- o Smoke cigarettes, provided cigarettes or cigars are properly extinguished and discarded.
- Conduct any work that has been covered by a current and relevant exemption, and provided that are all conditions on that exemption are adhered to.

DFES LSW Region Report - 10th December 2019

DFES LSW Incidents & Arrangements

9th & 10th October saw SES units from Margaret River, Busselton, Nannup & Bridgetown activated for a land search along the Blackwood River near Alexandra Bridge. The SES supported WAPOL in the successful location of a missing teenage boy who had become stranded in his canoe and walked off into the bush trying to get back to his camp site.

Winter resulted in no further significant storm events with local SES attending to isolated incidents around the region.

The Capes Zone response came into effect on the 1st of December, these arrangements have proved to be very successful over the past few years. Preparations are well underway in the lead up to the bushfire season. Events and forums bringing together agencies such as police, DFES, DBCA, Local government are planned to provide a coordinated response to the region over the summer period.

A new draft response arrangement is currently under development in the Blackwood catchment area that will see an enhanced response from local government, DFES & DBCA – including air craft support. An update to the DBCA & DFES response arrangements for the SW & LSW regions is also nearing completion for summer that will bolster the preparedness levels of these agencies over the 19/20 bushfire season. Both these arrangements are a result of the post incident analyses for the Lewana and Blackwood fires.

Wilyabrup have received a 2.4 with Sussex set to receive a LT towards the end of December.

Legislative Review of the Emergency Services Acts

Cabinet has approved the consolidation of the three emergency services Acts into a single piece of legislation. The Fire Brigades Act 1942, Bush Fires Act 1954 and Fire and Emergency Services Act 1998 will be replaced by one Act which will provide a strong foundation for effective emergency services management for the future.

Sadly Norm Flynn of the Busselton VFRS passed away on the 24th of November, Norm was a very influential member of the Busselton VFRS and community. Some of Norms achievements are listed below,
