BUSHFIRE

The Blackwood District have responded to around 97 fires this season. These have been a combination of lightning strikes, abandoned cars and some with suspicious and unconfirmed likely to be arson and these have been reported to Bunbury detectives.

PRESCRIBED BURNING

The department has completed approximately 9900 ha of Autumn prescribed burning across the Blackwood District. The Autumn achievements for prescribed burning are -

CHESTER MOONAH (Shire of Nannup) – 2500ha across the southern boundary which now is set up for a much larger area of approx. 14,000 ha in Spring/Autumn 2018/19.

JOLLY FOREST BLOCK (Shire of Bridgetown-Greenbushes and Boyup Brook)- 3981 ha

BYRON (Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup)- 500 ha

Ellis Creek (Shire of Nannup) – 349ha

MUNRO FOREST BLOCK (Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup)- 2000 ha

DFES LSW Region Report - 12th June 2018

Rural Fire Division

On the 20th April the WA State Government announced the creation of the Rural Fire Division (RDF) within the Department of Fire and Emergency Services. The Rural Fire Division will incorporate the Office of Bushfire Risk Management, a Bushfire Centre of Excellence, Bushfire Risk Management Programs and an increased focus on volunteer relations.

There is a significant amount of work that is required to be done implementing the Rural Fire Division over the next 6 months in the lead up to the next fire season, with further information on staffing and structure to be identified following the May State budget. For the DFES Lower South West Region John Tillman is currently acting as Chief Superintendent in the RFD, Danny Mosconi is filling the regional Superintendents position, Peter Thomas is in the District Officer Capes position and John Carter is covering the District Officer Emergency Management role.

Albany Task Force

It has been a busy end to the season with a large number of incidents within the region up to the end of May. I would like to thank the local BFB for their effort dealing with these and then supporting the LSW Task Force for Albany. A total of 9 appliances responded from the shire to support the Great Southern Region.

International Fire Fighters Day

International Firefighters day was held at the Busselton Fire and Rescue station on the 4th of May. There was representation from the local VFRS, BFB, DBCA, DFES, LG and Bunbury CFRS. The event was very successful and gave an opportunity for all to remember the sacrifices made by firefighters in their line of duty.

LSW Combined VFRS and BFB Leaders / Team development Forum

The LSW DFES region is planning a forum this year to focus on team development. The Forum will be conducted in the Margaret River area and will involve leaders from the Fire and Rescue and the Bush Fire Brigades from across the region. Invites to the various groups will be sent out shortly.
